## English Course Restrictions

**Table I: Humanities & Social Sciences.** BA English students cannot use ENG courses to meet their Table I requirements. No more than 2 courses can be taken from any one subject area.

**Table A Restrictions: Lower Liberals.** English courses are not available for credit. PHL 214 is not available for credit.

**Table B Restrictions: Upper Liberals.** English students cannot use ENG courses to meet their Table B requirements for upper-level liberal studies courses.
